 Introduction: Discuss the history behind the decoration of the Christmas tree; evergreen trees used for thousands of years to celebrate winter festivals (see website resource) Pagans brought evergreen trees into the home to represent fertility and new life during the darker months. They were first decorated in Germany in the 16th century using gingerbread, apples and nuts 	Resources: Spring – Dream Trees Paper Scissors Glue or selotape Pens / Paint
 Activities and Experiences: Depending on the time of year do one of the following three activities: Spring: Make your own Dream Tree (see instructions for this on STfL <u>website</u> – scroll down for images) eventually the class will have its very own dream forest! Summer: Go and visit your tree and draw / paint it, a fun way of doing this could be by using dot painting: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZnaVwuFDxeQ</u> Autumn: Go out to collect leaves from nearby and do some leaf rubbings Winter: Create your own Christmas tree decorations that you can take and hang on your new tree, these can be created using anything you have to hand, paper stars in different colours that are then laminated to protect from rain etc. Conclusion/ Plenary: Pupils to present their work to the class 	Pens / Paint Summer – Dot Painting Toothpick Paints Autumn – Leaf Rubbing Leaves Crayons Winter - Decorations Anything you have to hand!
